The Lady in the Van, adapted by Alan Bennett from his memoir, tells the true story of his unlikely friendship with Miss Shepherd, a homeless elderly woman, who lived in a battered van on his driveway for 15 years. Miss Shepherd was a promising concert pianist between the wars, drove an ambulance during World War II, then was twice rejected from becoming a nun and developed mental health issues. Well-educated, cantankerously articulate and deeply religious, she lived in a succession of vans around Camden until moving into his driveway in 1973. The Lady in the Van is based on his own recollections of the indomitable Miss Shepherd and is, as you would expect from Bennett, a beautifully observed, sharply intelligent and wonderfully witty drama.

This is a gutsy, economically written play which captures the realism, the pain and the practical necessity of living in conditions of continual challenge.

Set in a Hardingly photogenic, grimy, plausibly weathered distressed tenement, Austin's subtle lighting range captures the essence of its grimy realism.

It is effectively inhabited by a disparate collection of characters honestly reflecting the mores of the period and contributing equally to the powerful statement that love comes in an infinite variety of forms. While the young speak a different language and reflect modern mores (Cicero noting this 2000 years ago), love is recognisable in its infinite variety. And yes, it is beautiful. Would that I was still not only young at heart.

Dominic delicately and understatedly moulds the role of Tony into a forlorn and finally transient companion, while Lauren grasps the scared, insecure but overconfident Leah and delivers her with unflagging energy.

Luca and Matthew, as Jamie and Ste gradually enrich their respective roles as they move together, gathering strength, maturity and confidence from each other in their search for understanding and acceptance.

Katie, as brash mother Sandra delivers continuing reserves of quiet strength and wisdom, while holding the lives of all the others together.

Director Bruce has taken a connectedly disconnected handful of individuals, evocatively crafted by the author, and sculptured them all into a memorable, uninhibited, occasionally explosive, but always genuine 'family'.

THE BACH, by Stephen Sinclair, resonates with that most Kiwi of things: spending the summer at a bach at the beach. Many of us will remember that experience growing up — sometimes it seemed like entire towns uprooted after Christmas and headed for the Coromandel for their summer holiday!

THE BACH brings two Kiwi brothers together whilst grappling with the death of their father. It explores family as they deal with death of a parent, death of a marriage and accepting your siblings for who they are outside the bounds of a shared childhood and shared memories. Add in one wife and one budding Maori radical struggling to come to grips with her heritage and THE BACH is a New Zealand play for our times.

Annie Whittaker has been involved in the performing arts in one way or another since high school where she started out performing in musicals. Since then she did a bit of acting before starting a lengthy career in stage management and theatre teaching, for both community and professional theatre.
